Digital solutions are often incidental, ad hoc and project based, but will become pervasive with the on-going adoption of the Internet by citizens and governments, transforming information into knowledge using for instance the Semantic Web. A functional data driven government will not be support a single digital solution, but rather by a large number of difference platforms and solutions in increasingly complex and dynamic societies with different actors and smart participating citizens responsible for more executive tasks. A point of interest is the quality of design, the design process and the fact that requirements for citizens differ from professional based requirements within governmental bodies. Current developments in the information society towards a participatory society require wider attention and a more structural treatment for design.

With this track we aim to broaden and deepen analysis, strategic developments, future studies and innovation for (digital) citizens and (digital) governments on quality, synergy and implementation. This track therefore urges to discuss the is the character of such an 'ecology' of digital democratic solutions? What are its requirements and its architecture?

Scientific authors, practitioners and professionals, designers / developers are invited to reflect on the strategic role of design for (e-)democracy by discussing design theories, scenario's, concept studies and methods for:

- E-participation, co-creation, co-design, e-democracy, self-governance, networks, smart cities, IT infrastructures and architectures, standardizations, design theories, methods and frameworks;
- Design theories, methods and frameworks for e-democracy and e-governance
- Designing qualities, processes and criteria

- Challenges of participatory and co-design
- The necessity of new competences for designers
